## **Junior (Grades 3 to 6): Organic Aesthetics – Home Décor**

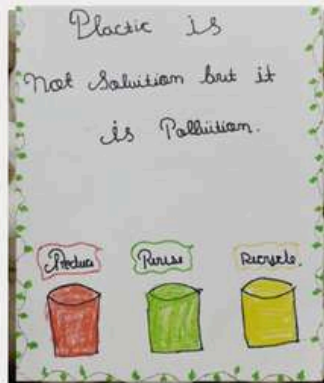
